The Jaffrey Meetinghouse's frame raised on the day of the Battle of Bunker Hill is the sole surviving Second Period Meetinghouse in the Monadnock Region. It's been in continuous use since 1775: as meetinghouse, church, high school, town offices, concert hall, theatre, etc. It's been well preserved and maintained and has been described as "Jaffrey's dearest possession." It is certainly the most recognized and loved building in the town. - Please provide a BRIEF description of what the proposed project will accomplish. (MAX 750 characters)

The Jaffrey Meetinghouse has had a wood roof from the very beginning. It was last re-roofed in 1995. Early in 2015 a roof leak caused damage to the ceiling in the main hall. This has been investigated and monitored since. The Town has retained the services of Catlin + Petrovick, architects of Keene, to assist the Town in planning for the necessary re-roofing. (They have concluded that repairs alone are insufficient and that a entirely new roof is necessary.) Catlin + Petrovick will develop specifications, assist in the bid process and oversee the work. They have estimated that up to \$100,000 will be required to undertake the project appropriately. A new roof, done well with the proper materials, will allow the Meetinghouse to continue serving the people of Jaffrey and those who come from away to enjoy its beauty and historical significance.
