"What is now known as The Buxton Family Association of America began with a family picnic at the home of Mary Buxton Parks (now Church) at Douglas, Massachusetts, in 1903. Those present were all descendants of Otis Buxton, son of Capt. James Buxton, a soldier of the American Revolution and a direct descendant of Anthony Buxton, a pioneer from England to America in 1637. This family picnic was so thoroughly enjoyed, that before we parted, another picnic plan was already under way for the following year. In 1904, the picnic was held at the Douglas Camp Ground with 30 attending. We expect to continue these gatherings as long as the name of Buxton continues."

BUXTONS have made history and memories to be shared and passed on from generation to generation. We ask you to please show your support by attending the Reunion and enjoying moments with family and friends as was done at the home of Mary Buxton Church in 1903 and nearly every year since.



MARY BUXTON CHURCH EDUCATIONAL FUND

THIS YEAR marks the 46th year the Buxton Family Association has awarded scholarships to the descendants of Anthony Buxton.

GERTRUDE ANGEL proposed the idea of a scholarship fund in 1966 at the Association's 61st Annual Reunion. Gertrude sought to honor the memory of her aunt, Mary Buxton Church, by establishing a fund in her aunt's name. The idea was embraced at the reunion and the "MARY BUXTON CHURCH EDUCATIONAL FUND" was born.

The Scholarship Program is one of the Buxton Family Association programs which provide a significant benefit to the children and families of Buxton Family Association members. It provides financial support to individuals who plan to pursue studies beyond the high school level.

While many assume this means college level study, it is not limited to that. With an emphasis on and frequent shortages today of skilled trades, these scholarships can help those interested in trade schools as well as four-year colleges. Students interested in trade schools, two-year programs as well as bachelors, masters and PhD programs are encouraged to apply. The key requirement for any school is that it is an accredited program.

A summary of the scholarship requirements include:

- Evidence the applicant is a direct descendant of Anthony Buxton, The Pioneer. This is accomplished by providing a summary tracing one's family line to him. Sample genealogical charts are available through the Chairperson.
- Proof of acceptance by the college/technical or trade school, typically in the form of a letter of admission to the selected institution.
- And finally, applicants are asked to provide a brief description of their career goals.

The deadline for applications is June 1st each year. Completed application materials are reviewed by the Scholarship Committee which then recommends action to the full Association membership at the August meeting. Applicants approved for a scholarship are notified in writing after that meeting.

Payment of the scholarship is made following completion of at least one semester of study which demonstrates the student earned a "C" or better grade point average. An official transcript from the school is acceptable proof of this academic requirement.

Our successful applicants for the 2024 awards (payable in 2025) were:

- **NORA CLEAR**, South Burlington, VT, Providence College, Political Science.
- **JONATHAN FRANK**, McCook, NE, University of Nebraska at Lincoln, Computer Engineering.
- Dana L. Mayhew, Dublin, NH, Nashua Community College, Collision Repair Technology.
- **ZACH QUITKIN**, Stratham, NH, Brown University, Computer Science and/or Chemistry.
- CAMRYN SULLIVAN, Stafford Springs, CT, University of Connecticut, Liberal Arts & Sciences, Molecular & Cell Biology.

Each applicant received a \$2,000 scholarship which includes \$100 to offset the potential impact of income taxes on the award.

With these six awards, the MARY BUXTON CHURCH EDUCATIONAL FUND has helped 139 ancestors of Anthony Buxton.

Donations to the fund in any amount are appreciated and will help the Buxton Family Association continue its 46-year history of support for our scholars.

IN MEMORIAM

We are sad to report the death of **Barbara Jane Buxton Boisse** (September 29, 1929–December 30, 2024), long-time member and genealogist of the Association.

Zephyrhills, FL – Barbara J. B. Boisse, beloved aunt, sister and friend, passed away peacefully December 30, 2024, at the Hospice Center in Zephyrhills, FL. She was 95 years old. Barbara was born in 1929 in Newton, MA, to Myron and Agnes (Porter) Buxton.

Barbara received her doctorate from Boston College and went on to become the Head of

Nursing for many facilities which caused her to move quite a bit. She was a very independent woman and was a woman of many talents. She enjoyed painting, gardening, quilting, sewing, and wood carving to just name a few. She also enjoyed traveling and was an active member of The Buxton Family Association as its Genealogist. Above all, she enjoyed spending time with her family just sitting back "taking it all in," with a big smile on her face. She

was known for sending her special greeting cards which always included a thoughtful message inside. Barbara will be missed by her family and many friends she met throughout her lifetime.

Barbara is survived by her nieces and nephews: Linda Warren, Paulette Dipersio and her husband Bob, Barbara Kozlowski, Dwight Buxton and his wife Karen, Kevin Buxton, Deborah Doetsch and her husband Bruce, Stephen Henry, David Henry and his wife Cindi and Alesia Clear and her husband Tim.

Barbara also leaves many great nieces and nephews and three godchildren: Wendy, Jimmy and Michael Warren.

Besides her parents, Barbara was predeceased by her brother, Myron Buxton Jr., her sister Virginia Henry, her nephew Gary Buxton, her niece Carol Dunn, and her great-nephew Logan Doetsch.

At Barbara's request and in keeping with her passion for medicine, her body was donated to the United Tissue Network of

Zephyrhills, Florida. An interment was held in the Buxton Family plot at Pleasant View Cemetery in Middletown Springs, Vermont.



THE BUXTON CEMETERY

OUR FAMILY cemetery is located on the southwest side of Rt. 146A in North Smithfield (Slatersville), RI. There are quite a few Buxtons resting here, the best known of them being Capt. James Buxton (1745–1817), a soldier



of the Revolution. He served at Valley Forge and Saratoga and for his heroism was deeded 300 acres by the Continental Congress.

Cemetery Chair, Steve Higgins, reports on recent activity: I mowed the cemetery for the first time on May 16th. There was no winter storm damage. On June 5th, I trimmed around the headstones and removed several bags of leaves. On May 18th, I attended a day-long handson seminar on cleaning, resetting, and repairing gravestones. It was held at the Swandale Cemetery in Mendon, MA, and was taught by a couple who donate much of their retirement to restoring cemeteries. There was no cost and the training was excellent. I helped clean and reset a Civil War veteran's stone and helped repair and reset two other monuments. I have been cleaning gravestones in our Buxton cemetery, using an excellent product called D2, which is non-toxic. I have started removing years of accumulated leaves from the street side of the cemetery. I should be able to complete the task this summer.

There's a second nearby Buxton cemetery in North Smithfield. One needs to traipse 500 feet through the fields and woods to find the handful of graves (actually only two legible headstones). It's on private land but legally it's accessible by the public. There is a sign identifying it as a "Rhode Island Historical Cemetery #2." It's not maintained and could really do with some tidying up. Another project for the BFA?
